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MANAGEMENT REPORT 2025

For the year ended 31 December 2025

1. Objectives, Mission and Vision

Stichting Children of Heroes of Ukraine was established to provide long-term support to children who have lost one or both parents as a result of the war in Ukraine.

The Foundation pursues its objectives by raising funds and supporting programmes aimed at meeting the educational, humanitarian, healthcare, psychological and social needs of beneficiary children and their families.

The Foundation works in close cooperation with Ukrainian Charity Foundation “Children of Heroes” registered in Ukraine, which serves as the implementing partner responsible for programme delivery and direct support to beneficiaries.

The Foundation’s mission is to ensure that children who lost one or both parents as a result of the war in Ukraine receive sustainable support and opportunities for development until adulthood.

The Foundation’s vision according to the Policy Plan of the Foundation as of October 3, 2024 is a future in which every child who has lost a parent/parents due to the war in Ukraine has access to the resources, opportunities and support necessary to build an independent and successful life.

2. Governance

The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors and supervised by a Supervisory Board.

Members of the Board of Directors and Supervisory Board perform their duties on a voluntary basis and receive no remuneration.

The Foundation maintains regular communication with donors, implementing partners and other stakeholders through donor reporting, fundraising campaigns, public communications and its website.

3. Achievement of Objectives

During 2025, the Foundation pursued its objectives through financial support provided to Ukrainian Charity Foundation “Children of Heroes” registered in Ukraine, which implements programmes and provides direct assistance to beneficiary families.

The Foundation contributed to programmes focused on:

- Education and development;
- Psychological support and socialisation;
- Humanitarian assistance;
- Healthcare support;
- Holiday gifts and celebrations;
- Emergency assistance;
- Other initiatives supporting children affected by the war in Ukraine.

As of 1 January 2026, 15,227 children who had lost one or both parents as a result of the war in Ukraine were eligible for support through the Children of Heroes programme.

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The Foundation believes that its financial support contributed to the continued expansion and development of these programmes and helped advance its charitable mission.

The increase in the number of supported children demonstrates the continuing need for long-term assistance to families affected by the war in Ukraine and confirms the ongoing relevance of the Foundation's activities.

4. Financial Developments

During 2025, the Foundation received total income of EUR 253,074.

Total expenditures amounted to EUR 145,227 and consisted of:

- Charitable objective expenses: EUR 101,228
- Fundraising expenses: EUR 16,673
- Management and administrative expenses: EUR 27,326

As a result, the Foundation reported a surplus of EUR 107,847 for the year ended 31 December 2025.

Cash and cash equivalents amounted to EUR 127,923 at year-end.

Allocation of Expenses

The Foundation allocated approximately:

- 69.7% of total expenditures to charitable objectives;
- 11.5% to fundraising activities;
- 18.8% to management and administration.

Management considers this allocation appropriate for an organization in a growth phase that is simultaneously expanding fundraising activities and strengthening governance and operational infrastructure.

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Fundraising Activities

Fundraising activities during 2025 included engagement with individual donors, high-net-worth individuals, corporate donors and philanthropic partners.

The Foundation continued to strengthen donor relationships and fundraising processes in order to support future programme growth.

Reserves and Funds

At 31 December 2025, the Foundation reported total equity of EUR 87,925.

Restricted funds amounted to EUR 10,903 and represent donations received for specific purposes that had not yet been fully utilized at year-end.

The remaining equity is available to support the Foundation's future charitable activities and operational continuity.

5. Principal Risks and Uncertainties

The Foundation continuously monitors risks that may affect its ability to achieve its objectives.

The principal risks identified by management include:

Fundraising Risk

The Foundation depends on voluntary donations from individuals, corporations and philanthropic partners. A reduction in donor funding could adversely affect the Foundation's ability to support charitable programmes.

Growing Beneficiary Demand

The number of children requiring support continues to increase as a result of the ongoing war in Ukraine. Growth in beneficiary needs may exceed the growth in available funding.

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Operational Dependence on Implementing Partners

The Foundation relies on Ukrainian Charity Foundation “Children of Heroes” registered in Ukraine for programme implementation and delivery of support to beneficiaries.

Regulatory and Compliance Risk

The Foundation engages in cross-border fundraising and activities and must comply with applicable legal, tax, charity and reporting requirements.

Foreign Exchange Risk

As the Foundation engages in cross-border fundraising and activities and supports programmes in Ukraine while maintaining relationships with foreign donors and related organizations, fluctuations in exchange rates may affect the value of assets, liabilities, income and expenditures.

6. Future Outlook

The Foundation expects to continue expanding its fundraising activities and strengthening relationships with existing and new donors.

During 2026, the Foundation intends to:

- Continue supporting programmes for children affected by the war in Ukraine;
- Expand fundraising efforts and donor acquisition activities;
- Strengthen donor engagement and reporting practices;
- Further develop cooperation with implementing partners;
- Improve operational, governance and compliance processes;
- Increase the proportion of resources directed toward programme activities and beneficiary support.

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Budget

The Foundation uses internal forecasts and planning assumptions to support operational decision-making and resource allocation.

7. Social Aspects of Operations

The Foundation's activities are primarily focused on social impact.

Through its fundraising and grant-making activities, the Foundation contributes to the long-term well-being, education, healthcare and social integration of children who have lost one or both parents as a result of the war in Ukraine.

The Foundation believes that these activities generate a positive social impact both for beneficiary families and for the broader communities in which they live.

The Foundation's environmental impact is limited due to the nature of its activities. The Foundation seeks to use resources responsibly and efficiently in carrying out its mission.

8. Volunteers

The Foundation did not employ staff during 2025.

Its activities were carried out through the voluntary efforts of members of the Board of Directors, members of the Supervisory Board and other volunteer supporters, including finance, legal and fundraising support.

Fundraising support during 2025 was also provided by a volunteer fundraiser.

No remuneration, employment contracts or service agreements were in place with these volunteers.

4. Notes to the financial statements

Entity information

Registered address and registration number trade register

The registered and actual address of Stichting Children of Heroes of Ukraine is Somansstraat 68 A in Rotterdam and is registered at the chamber of commerce under number 90057724.

General notes

General notes

The most important activities of the entity

The activities of Stichting Children of Heroes of Ukraine, established in Rotterdam, consists mainly of:

- Provide long-term support in every possible form to children and their families who lost one or both parents as a result of military aggression of the Russian Federation against Ukraine until those children reach adulthood.

The foundation endeavors to achieve this by creating and funding of support programs to be determined by the board of directors.

Estimates

Disclosure of estimates

When preparing the financial statements, the directors are required by generally accepted accounting principles to use various estimates and assumptions in determining amounts in the financial statements. Actual results may differ from estimates made.

General accounting principles

General accounting principles

The accounting standards used to prepare the financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Standard C2k Small fundraising organisations ('Kleine fondsenwervende organisaties') and the firm pronouncements in the Dutch Accounting Standards, as published by the Dutch Accounting Standards Board ('Raad voor de Jaarverslaggeving').

The valuation of assets and liabilities, as well as the determination of the result, is based on historical costs. Unless otherwise stated in the specific basis for the balance sheet item, assets and liabilities are valued according to the historical cost model

Income from fundraising and expenses are allocated to the year to which they relate. Income is only recognized to the extent that it has been realized as of the balance sheet date. Obligations and potential losses originating before the end of the reporting year are taken into account if they have become known before the preparation of the financial statements.

Comparison with the previous year

The applied principles of valuation and profit determination remained unchanged compared to the previous year, except for the applied changes as included in the respective sections.

Foreign currency translation

Transactions in foreign currencies are stated in the financial statements at the exchange rate of the functional currency on the transaction date.

Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are converted to the closing rate on the balance sheet date of the functional currency.

The translation differences resulting from settlement and conversion are credited or charged to the income statement.

Non-monetary assets measured at historical cost in a foreign currency are converted at the exchange rate on the transaction date.

Non-monetary assets (other than goodwill) measured at fair value in a foreign currency are converted at the exchange rate on the date on which the fair value was determined. Translation differences on intragroup long-term loans that effectively constitute an increase or decrease in net investments in a foreign operation are directly recognized in equity as a component of the legal reserve for translation differences.

Translation differences on foreign currency loans contracted to finance a net investment in a foreign operation are recognized in the legal reserve for currency translation differences if and when such loans effectively hedge the exchange rate exposure on that net investment in a foreign operation.

ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES FOR THE VALUATION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

Receivables and accrued assets

Receivables are recorded initially at fair value and then at amortized cost, net of any provision for doubtful debts, determined individually. On initial recognition the fair value and the amortized cost are the same as the face value.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash at banks and in hand represent cash in hand, bank balances and deposits with terms of less than twelve months. Overdrafts at banks are recognized as part of debts to lending institutions under current liabilities. Cash at banks and in hand is carried at nominal value.

Current liabilities

Current liabilities are initially valued at fair value. After initial recognition, short-term liabilities are valued at amortized cost. In cases where there is no (dis)count and transaction costs, the amortized cost equals the nominal value.

ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES FOR THE DETERMINATION OF THE RESULT

General result determination

The result is the difference between the income from donations and the expenses and other charges during the year. The results on transactions are recognized in the year in which they are realized.

Donations

Donations are recognized as income when donation is legally provided to the foundation and when the foundation has performed its service obligations, if any.

Basis for the preparation of the cash flow statement

The cash flow statement has been prepared using the indirect method

The cash and cash equivalents in the cash flow statement consist of cash and cash equivalents.

Cash flows in foreign currencies are translated at an estimated average exchange rate. Exchange rate differences related to cash and cash equivalents are separately presented in the cash flow statement

Receipts and payments related to interest, received dividends, and income taxes are included in the cash flow from operating activities.

The designated funds relate to received donations with a restricted purpose, which have not yet been fully utilized per the end of the financial year.

During the start-up phase in 2023 and 2024, the Foundation incurred operating and program-related expenses that were partially financed through support provided by Children of Heroes of Ukraine Foundation (USA). As a result, the Foundation reported a negative equity position as at 31 December 2024. Due to significant fundraising growth in 2025, the Foundation generated a surplus of EUR 107.847 and restored its equity position to a positive balance of EUR 87.925 as at 31 December 2025.

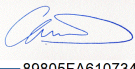

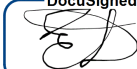

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To: the General Meeting of Shareholders of Stichting Children of Heroes of Ukraine

Report on the audit of the financial statements 2025 included in the annual report

Our opinion

We have audited the financial statements 2025 of Stichting Children of Heroes of Ukraine based in Rotterdam.

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of Stichting Children of Heroes of Ukraine as at 31 December 2025 and of its result for 2025 in accordance with the 'RJ-Richtlijn C2k Kleine fondsenwervende organisaties' (Guideline for annual reporting 'C2k Small fundraising organisations' of the Dutch Accounting Standards Board).

The financial statements comprise:

1. the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2025;
2. the statement of activities for 2025; and
3. the notes comprising a summary of the accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Basis for our opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Dutch law, including the Dutch Standards on Auditing. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the 'Our responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements' section of our report.

We are independent of Stichting Children of Heroes of Ukraine in accordance with the Verordening inzake de onafhankelijkheid van accountants bij assurance-opdrachten (ViO, Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants, a regulation with respect to independence) and other relevant independence regulations in the Netherlands. Furthermore, we have complied with the Verordening gedrags- en beroepsregels accountants (VGBA, Dutch Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants).

We believe the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Report on the other information included in the annual report

The annual report contains other information, in addition to the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Based on the following procedures performed, we conclude that the other information is consistent with the financial statements and does not contain material misstatements.

By performing these procedures, we comply with the requirements of the Dutch Standard 720. The scope of the procedures performed is substantially less than the scope of those performed in our audit of the financial statements.

Management is responsible for the preparation of the other information, including the management report in accordance with 'RJ-Richtlijn C2k Kleine fondsenwervende organisaties' (Guideline for annual reporting 'C2k Small fundraising organisations' of the Dutch Accounting Standards Board).

Description of responsibilities regarding the financial statements

Responsibilities of management for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with 'RJ-Richtlijn C2k Kleine fondsenwervende organisaties' (Guideline for annual reporting 'C2k Small fundraising organisations' of the Dutch Accounting Standards Board). Furthermore, management is responsible for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

As part of the preparation of the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the company's ability to continue as a going concern. Based on the financial reporting framework mentioned, management should prepare the financial statements using the going concern basis of accounting, unless management either intends to liquidate the company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Management should disclose events and circumstances that may cast significant doubt on the company's ability to continue as a going concern in the financial statements.

Our responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Our objective is to plan and perform the audit engagement in a manner that allows us to obtain sufficient and appropriate audit evidence for our opinion.

Our audit has been performed with a high, but not absolute, level of assurance, which means we may not detect all material errors and fraud during our audit.

Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements. The materiality affects the nature, timing and extent of our audit procedures and the evaluation of the effect of identified misstatements on our opinion.

We have exercised professional judgement and have maintained professional scepticism throughout the audit, in accordance with Dutch Standards on Auditing, ethical requirements and independence requirements. Our audit included among others:

- identifying and assessing the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, designing and performing audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtaining audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control;
- obtaining an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control;
- evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management;
- concluding on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting, and based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion.
